PSU Community Counseling Clinic

 - Life changes from acquired disabilities
 - Coping skills for emotional and physical stress
 - Marriage & family therapy for relationship troubles

- Cost \$15 each; request reduced fee if needed

Counselor vs. Psychologist vs. Psychiatrist

- All three:
 - Help build a deeper sense of self and awareness
 - Listen and provide **guidance** for healing
 - Create **goals/objectives**; select interventions for therapy
 - Counselors and psychologists share many similarities
- Counselors must have (at least) a master's degree
 - Focus on **overall wellness** and using helpful **strategies**
- Psychologists must have a clinical doctorate
 - Can do higher level psychological/cognitive testing
- Psychiatrists are medical doctors
 - Prescribe medications and other medical treatments.
 - Provide psychotherapy and psychological services
